One good deed leads to another

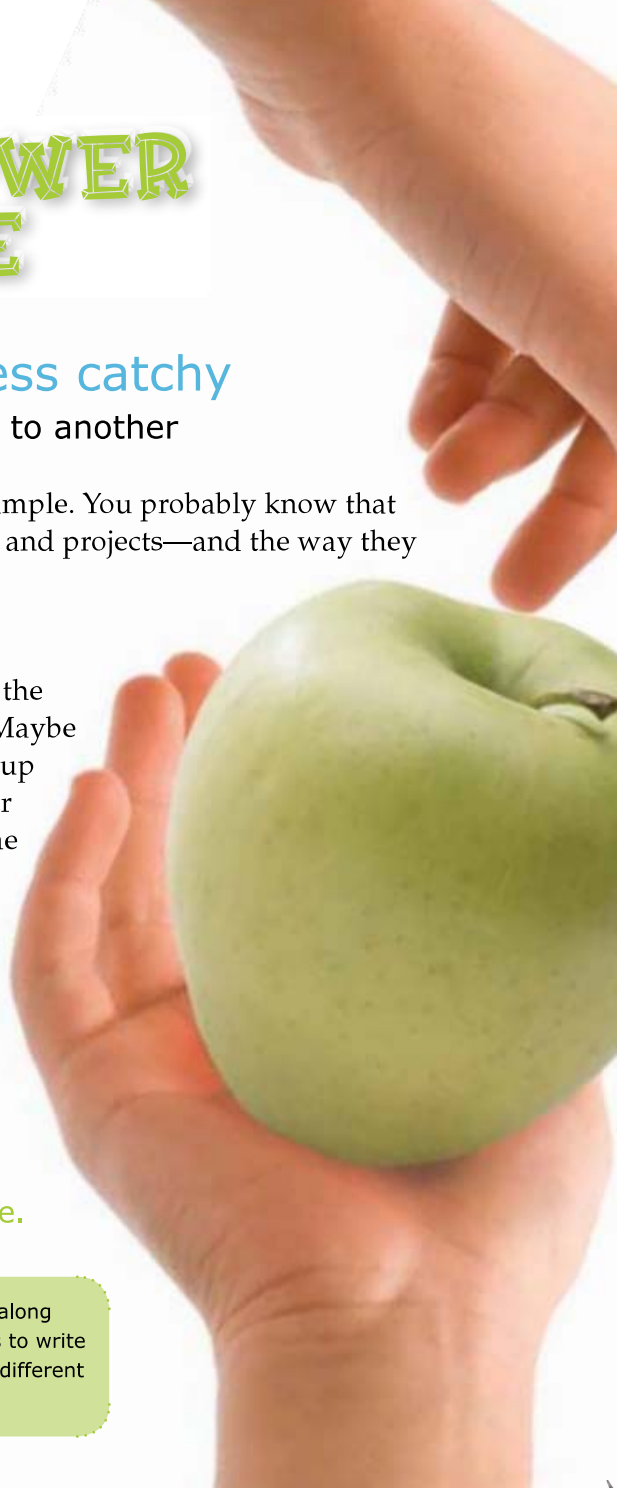
As a K-Kid, you set an example. You probably know that from your club's activities and projects—and the way they help your community.
