This year's themes include [The Eliminate Project](#), a program that helps keep moms and babies healthy around the world. Here are the 2011-12 K-Kids contest themes:

Essay

Start a story with these words: "Once upon a time, a K-Kids club ... "
Tell what activities or projects your K-Kids club did that teach a moral or lesson.

Letter

Write a letter to a newborn about the fun he or she will have in life.

Speech

How can one K-Kid's act of kindness make a difference in the world?

Art: K-Kids theme

Draw a coloring book page about K-Kids. Write one sentence under the picture describing what's happening in the picture. (Remember, a coloring book page is drawn with black marker and space is left to color with crayons.) *K-Kids members are welcome to submit a second copy that has been colored with crayons, markers or colored pencils, but the original coloring page created with black marker is what will be judged and used to create the K-Kids coloring book.*

Art: Healthy moms and babies

Draw what it would look like if all mothers and babies were healthy. Write one sentence under the picture describing what's happening in the picture. (Remember, a coloring book page is drawn with black marker and space is left to color with crayons.)

Club Single Service

With fellow members, tell about the club's best service project this school year.

Scrapbook

With fellow members, make a scrapbook that shows your club's service in your school and community.

Leadership Award

Any K-Kids member can be nominated for the Kiwanis International Foundation Leadership Award. The member is recognized for demonstrating outstanding leadership abilities.
