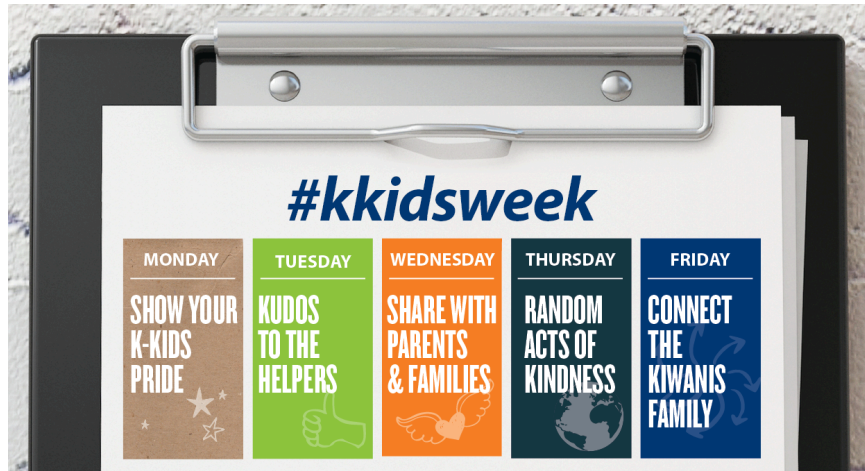

These events can include fundraising walks, dances, donation drives and celebrations. Sadie Curtis K-Kids Club in Nassau, Bahamas, holds its Father and Son Breakfast every year. The 2025 event included an inspiring guest speaker, Michael Butler, who talked about the crucial role that fathers play in shaping their children's lives. He encouraged them to instill strong values and continue to be positive role models.



4 TIPS FOR PROMOTING YOUR EVENT

The better your club is at promoting its events, the more participation you'll get — whether it's volunteers, donations or community support. Here are four things to remember:

- **Do the groundwork.** Start by creating a solid event plan and timeline.
- **Develop a short description.** Clearly explain what the event or activity is, when and where it's happening and how people can get involved. Give them the information they need to participate and include a clear action you want them to take (for example, buying a ticket today or bringing 10 cans to homeroom by Friday).
- **Market it.** Create flyers, posters, social media posts and emails. Don't forget school announcements and bulletin boards. Do an interview and get it in the school newsletter. Ask an administrator to add your event to the school calendar. Send information home to families.
- **Spread the word!** Tell friends, teachers and families.
